4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation:	Move to fresh air. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. Get medical attention.

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Handling:

Keep away from heat, spark and flame. Prevent contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Do not breathe vapor and mist. Wash thoroughly after handling. Vapors will accumulate readily and may ignite explosively.

Storage:

Heat from sunlight, radiators, stoves, hot water, and other heat sources could cause container to burst. Do not puncture, incinerate, or expose to temperatures above 48.9 °C (120 °F). Store away from ignition sources. Keep in a cool, well ventilated area.
